



Can Hiccup save the tribe - and become a Hero?




Brightstorm – Vashti Hardy

The Midnight Gang – David Walliams




The Queen's Nose – Dick King-Smith


Alex Sparrow And The Really Big Stink – Jennifer Killick


The Lion, The Witch And The Wardrobe – CS Lewis


Hats for cats! Pet pigs for all! Banana shaped buses!


The Snow Spider – Jenny Nimmo

The Wind In The Willows – Kenneth Grahame






Dragons At Crumbling Castle – Terry Pratchett

But there's a teeny weeny surprise in store . . .




The Firework Maker's Daughter – Philip Pullman



Tilly And The Time Machine – Danny Noble



But then something goes wrong! Tilly's dad gets stuck in the past and only she can save him...




James And The Giant Peach – Roald Dahl


The Indian In The Cupboard – Lynne Reid Banks


One Dog And His Boy – Eva Ibbotson

<u>The Animals Of Farthing Wood – Colin Dann</u>


