Dear Parents and Carers,

Information about Year 6 SATs 12th May – 15th May 2025

As you will be aware, next week the Year 6 children will be sitting their SATs. We are incredibly proud of how hard the children have worked and the progress that they have made. We know that they are ready to achieve their best.

Below is a breakdown of the tests:

Date	Paper 9.05am start
Monday 12 th May 2025	Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG Paper 1) Spelling Test (SPaG Paper 2)
Tuesday 13 th May 2025	Reading
Wednesday 14 th May 2025	Maths Arithmetic (Paper 1) Maths Reasoning 1 (Paper 2)
Thursday 15 th May 2025	Maths Reasoning 2 (Paper 3)

We would ask that you ensure that your child attends school each day during this week. It is really important that if your child is feeling unwell overnight or before school, you inform the office by 8.15am so we can advise as to the next steps. We want to ensure that your child has the opportunity to sit their paper when they are fully fit and able to show their best.

It is also vitally important that pupils have a good night's sleep and arrive at school on time each day. We would encourage the children to take part in enjoyable and relaxing activities after school to help them to be ready for the next day. To help them relax, we won't be setting homework this week but would encourage the children to revise any areas that they are less confident with.

To enable the children to come into school and feel relaxed, we are offering breakfast snacks to help ensure that the children are prepared fully for their assessments. We will also be celebrating their week by having a film afternoon on Friday. The children will be allowed to bring in snacks that they might like to enjoy the film with.

Finally, and most importantly, remind them that they have worked hard for these tests and all they can do now is try their best. Their best is always good enough. SATs only measures a small part of who they are, there is so much more to celebrate!
