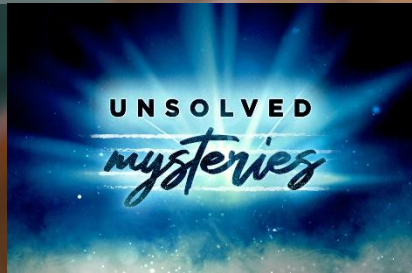
Please research or design your own 'unsolved mystery' which can be presented any way that you like.

Your work should cover the 5 w's: who, what, where, when, why ('how' might be useful to your reader too).

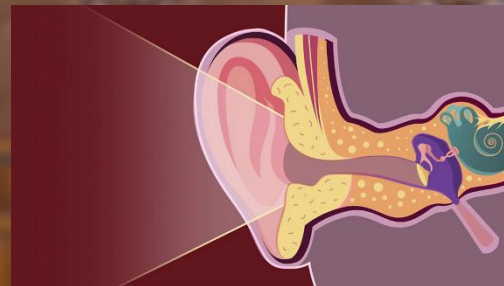
Example topics include: the Lochness Monster, Area 51, Banksy, crop circles.
