National Phonics Screening Check

We are writing to inform you of the National Phonics Screening Check taking place in Key Stage 1 during the week beginning 9th June. This letter aims to explain this process, in addition to providing you with ideas to help your child with phonics at home.

Who takes the test?

All children in year 1 will take the Test. In addition, any child currently in year 2 who did not reach the required level when they took the test in year 1 will take the test again in year 2. If we feel that there is a valid reason why your child should not take the test in Year 1, the class teacher will discuss this with you. Please note, this is only done in exceptional circumstances and your child would still be eligible to sit the test when they are in Year 2.
